Jubilee Open

Competition terms

- 1. Entrants must be amateur status as defined by the current Rules of Amateur status, with an active handicap index.
- 2. The Competition will be held on a handicap basis in accordance with the WHS Rules of Handicapping and Rules of Golf as approved by R&A Rules Ltd. The Model Local Rules in the Rules of Golf are in effect regarding Conforming Driver Heads, Conforming Golf Balls and Groove and Punch Marks.
- 3. Once any member completes 10 holes within a competition run by The St Andrews Golf Club, this will be deemed as intending to return a score. Should the member subsequently wish to highlight a reason for withdrawing during the round, this must be in writing to the Club Secretary. The Match Secretary and Captain or Vice-Captain would then decide on whether the member is to be removed from the competition on a case-by-case basis.
- 4. There is no handicap index limit for this Competition, however, please note the maximum handicap allowance will be 28, regardless of whether your course/playing handicap exceeds this.
- 5. This is a Qualifying Competition.
- 6. All tee times, whether reserved or unreserved, should be played in a maximum of 4-balls, unless any change is communicated by the Management Committee.
- 7. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry without assigning a reason.
- 8. One round of 18 holes over the Jubilee Bronze Course in a Strokeplay format.
- 9. In the event of play being delayed, any changes to the format of the Tournament will be at the discretion of the Committee.
- 10. The member shall start at the time laid down by the Committee, who reserves the right to alter starting times and to alter or amend any of the Conditions. Once the closing date has passed, tee times allocated cannot be changed. Late entries may be accepted dependent on the entry levels.
- 11. This Competition is 95% of course handicap allowance.
- 12. Entries will be limited to 180 competitors.
- 13. It is each player's responsibility to ensure that their exact handicap is up to date at the time of entry and at commencement of the competition.
- 14. In the event of a tie, this will be resolved on the best last 9 holes (or 6 or 3 or 2 or 1 hole) followed by the best front 9 holes (or 6 or 3 or 2 or 1 hole). In the event of a tie after countback, this will be decided by ballot or a manner deemed appropriate at the discretion of the Committee.
- 15. The use of buggies will only be allowed in the Competition by competitors who have met the requirements for using a buggy on the course and must not be shared by another competitor or playing partner.
- 16. Caddies are permitted within the Competition.
- 17. All competitors are already signed in to the competition for the day.
- 18. The Committee's decision in all disputes is final.
- 19. The Competition result will be notified to all golfers via email and individual winners will be contacted directly. All vouchers will be issued within 14 days of the Competition. The results will also be posted on the Club's web site.

Entry Terms

- 1. Entries will only be considered, until the closing date set by the Management Committee, from amateur status players with an active handicap index. Handicaps will be determined by the current WHS Rules of Handicapping scheme or equivalent.
- Entries are limited to 180 competitors and will be accepted by date and time of entry, until the closing date. The Committee will reserve 24 places for members of The St Andrews Golf Club.
- 3. All entries will be submitted using the entry form provided by The St Andrews Golf Club and must be submitted with the entry fee and your CDH number. No entry will be accepted without the entry fee.
- 4. The entry fee is £45 for visitors and £20 for members of The St Andrews Golf Club and includes the competition round of golf and a 2-course meal within The St Andrews Golf Club. This will be determined by the Committee.
- 5. Entries will open from **10:00 on Monday 8 January 2024** via HowDidiDo, on a first come, first served basis.
- 6. At the date of entry and date of the Competition, entrants must be an active member of a recognised Golf Club. On the online entry form please enter your CDH number (for

entrants from Scotland, England, Ireland or Wales) or for overseas entrants, attach your current handicap certificate at the time of entry. NB: It is the player's responsibility to ensure that their exact handicap index is up to date.

- 7. The closing date for receipt of entries is 16:00 Monday 11 March 2024.
- 8. The draw will be made by Tuesday 7 May 2024.
- 9. Should the entry number exceed the maximum number of 180 places, a list of reserves will be prepared according to, firstly, date and time of entry received and secondly, exact handicap index. Any vacancies as a result of competitors withdrawing after the closing date will be filled from the list of reserves. Members must have written confirmation of their name being added to the draw from the Club Secretary or Club Official.
- 10. If you notify us of your subsequent withdrawal prior to the closing date, you will receive a 100% refund. If notification is received after this date, you will receive a 50% refund. If you do not turn up on the day, you will not receive a refund. The Committee will consider a full / partial refund on a case-by-case basis.
